Timothy W. Sullivan '71, CEO Bucyrus International, (Retired)



Tim Sullivan'71 was most recently president and chief executive officer of Bucyrus International Inc. in Oak Creek, WI. During Tim's tenure, Bucyrus moved from the 25th fastest growing U.S. company in 2009 to the 8th fastest growing U.S. company in 2010 according to rankings published annually by Forbes. **"We are proud to be able to provide good paying job opportunities in this particular economy."** Tim left Bucyrus last summer upon the completion of the company's acquisition by Caterpillar Inc.

Tim serves as a trustee at Carroll University in Waukesha where he obtained his undergraduate degree, and where his mother, Eleanor, served as a librarian. A champion of education and workforce development, he is co-chair of the expansion campaign for Milwaukee College Prep, an urban elementary school member of the Milwaukee Parental School Choice program. Tim is also a current or recent member of the boards of organizations including Big Brothers Big Sisters, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, Greater Milwaukee Committee, Metropolitan Milwaukee Association of Commerce, Northwestern Mutual, Medical College of Wisconsin and United Way.

Then you look back and reflect on how the marriage of education and experience prepared you for success. It makes you want to give back and to ensure those same opportunities for today's kids."**
