

DRESS CODE

The dress code for summer school is casual. Students are expected to wear clean, respectful clothing consistent with the core values of Catholic Memorial High School. 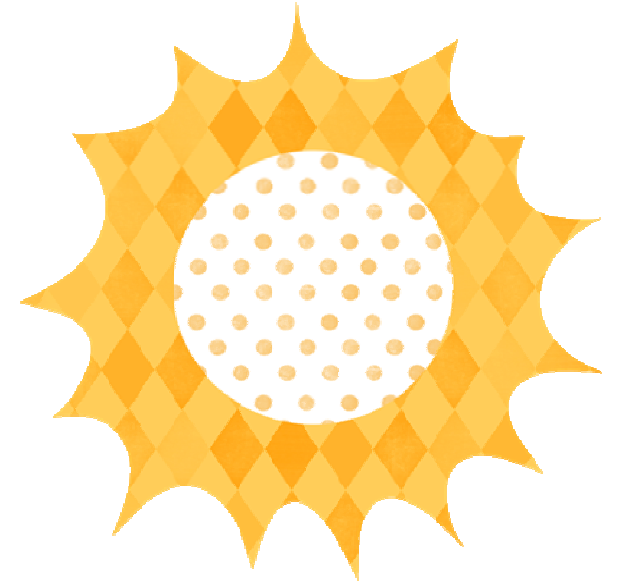

COURSE REGISTRATION

Students may reserve a spot in the CMH Summer School by sending in a registration form along with a deposit of \$25. The deadline for registration is June 5, 2009.

COURSE TUITION

The total cost of a Summer School course is \$375. The registration fee is applied to tuition. The tuition must be paid prior to attending a class. Tuition is not refundable after the second day of class.

COURSE GRADES

A student will receive ½ credit for the successful completion of each summer school course. A course grade will be submitted by the teacher for inclusion on the student's Catholic Memorial High School transcript. Credits will apply toward a student's graduation requirements. Grades will be factored into a student's grade point average.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance will be taken by the teacher each day. Students who are absent more than two days do not meet the required hours for the course and will be dropped from the class. All absences need to be reported by a parent to the Main Office at Catholic Memorial High School at 262.542.7101.

COURSE OFFERINGS

Physical Education I – ½ credit

This course will meet the semester requirements of Physical Education I for freshmen. A variety of fitness and team activities will be used to provide lifelong fitness activities for students. *Morning Session*

Health – ½ credit

This course meets the health graduation requirement. It will explore the areas of physical, mental, social, and spiritual health. Topics will include total health, nutrition, human growth and development, substance abuse, and first aid and safety. *Afternoon Session*

Leadership Development – ½ credit

Through case studies, role plays and interviews, students learn the critical life skills of how effective teams communicate and problem solve in the workplace. A great deal of emphasis is placed on self-assessment and helping discover one's own leadership styles.

To complete the course, the student must create a career plan focusing on five values that they wish to take with them throughout their life and work. *Tuesdays - June 16, 23, 30, July 7, 14, 21, - 8:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.*

Marketing Principles – ½ credit

Explore marketing principles as found in the American business system, with an emphasis on consumer behavior, consumer and industrial products, distribution, market research, market segmentation, promotion, pricing, and international marketing.
