History

Catholic Memorial High School was founded out of the dream of visionaries

in the Waukesha County area. In the early 1920's, the parishioners of St. Joseph Parish raised a fund of \$10,000 for a future high school. Their goal of providing a high quality Catholic education for the area's youth was strong and unwavering. This fervent hope became a reality in 1949 when CMH opened its doors as a parochial school for St. Joseph Parish.

Ninety-seven freshmen started attending classes in September of that year. The school was named in gratitude as a memorial to the 23 young men of St. Joseph's who gave their lives for their country in World War II. Later, the dedication of the school was extended to include all graduates of Catholic Memorial who have died in service to their country.





Catholic Identity

Catholic Memorial High School is committed to the formation of the whole person

and provides a variety of ways to nurture the faith and spirituality of our community. The Campus Ministry Department is concerned with the faith formation of students, faculty, and staff.

We offer a wide range of opportunities for students to experience their faith through the sacraments including:

- The celebration of the Eucharist on a school-wide basis at least once a month, on Holy Days of Obligation, and in Chapel masses four days a week
- Weekly opportunities for the sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)
- Masses for athletic teams, clubs, and other extracurricular activities

We also provide a multitude of ways for students to put their faith into action including:

- Witnessing through the Pro-Life club
- Service projects coordinated through Service Club, NHS, athletic teams and academic classes
- Advocacy through International Outreach and Operation Michael
- Faith Leadership through the Campus Ministry Leadership Team

Catholic Memorial High School prides itself on offering annual retreat experiences that enhance what is taught and lived on a daily basis.

Freshman A day-long retreat focusing on our school motto, *Charity in All Things*.

Sophomore An overnight retreat centered on different types of relationships and their importance in our lives.

Junior Most juniors are preparing for Confirmation and will attend a retreat through their home parish.

Senior A three-day retreat, held off campus, is the culmination of a student's four years at Catholic Memorial. The retreat focuses on their sense of self, their relationships with others, and their commitment to living their Catholic faith.

Our Mission

At Catholic Memorial High School, we **educate** students as individuals, intellectually and spiritually.

Theology Curriculum

Catholic Memorial High School focuses on learning and living Christian values.

The Judeo-Christian Tradition – year-long course required of all freshmen

This course examines the key themes of our faith tradition from both an academic and personal perspective using the Bible as a primary source. Students will learn the critical tools needed to interpret the Bible in a Catholic context.

Sacraments – required of all sophomores

In this course the Sacraments are presented as signs of Christ living and loving within the actions of the Christian community. A great emphasis is placed on Jesus as the greatest sacrament.

Christian Morality – required of all sophomores

Using the light of Sacred Scripture and Catholic Tradition, this course inquires into personal and societal conduct that is compatible with our dignity as human persons.

Theology 3 – year-long course required of all juniors

The first semester will focus on Church History, telling the story of the Church through analysis



of the major events and key persons who have shaped it. The third quarter will focus on Social Justice, the social mission of the Catholic Church which grew out of Jesus Christ's

concern for the dignity of all persons, especially the poor and powerless. The fourth quarter will focus on Medical Ethics, a specialized sequel to Christian Morality.

Senior Electives

Seniors are required to take two semesters of theology and have the option of choosing from a wide variety of semester long theology classes to fulfill their curriculum requirement. See our web site for full course descriptions:

Admission to Catholic Memorial High School is open to applicants who have indicated their ability to follow the course of studies provided by Catholic Memorial and whose conduct has been such to recommend them.

Admissions Process for Incoming Freshmen

1. Complete and submit Application for Admission with \$25 application fee by Oct. 31st.
2. Register for placement test by Nov. 1. All students taking the placement test must have a completed application on file, along with the \$25 fee.
3. All applicants who have submitted their applications will receive notification of their acceptance to Catholic Memorial by January 1.
4. All registration materials, tuition assistance forms and placement test results will be mailed during the first week of January.
5. Registration night for all accepted students is held in the evening on the last Monday in January.

CMH offers prospective students the opportunity to “shadow” one of our current freshmen or sophomores.

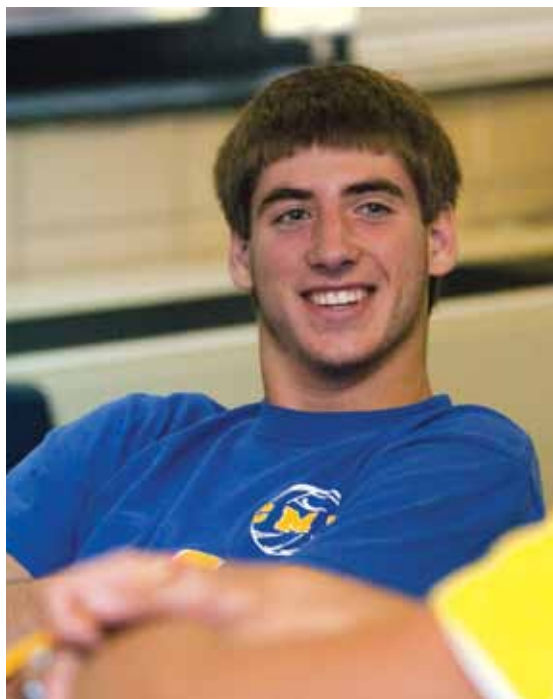
Why? A shadow day gives your son or daughter the chance to experience a typical day of high school at Catholic Memorial.

Range Of Assistance Awarded

Dress Code

Students at CMH are expected to dress in a manner that indicates their understanding of the difference between clothing that is appropriate for a Catholic school and clothing that considered suitable for recreational settings. Our dress code centers on the belief that students should always dress within the parameters of Christian modesty, self-respect, neatness and safety.

- Clothing that is neat and clean
- Shirts with or without collars
- Shoulder straps for tops and dresses that are at least three inches of width on the shoulder
- Shirts, tops and dresses that completely cover the bust line and midriff
- Dress slacks, khakis, jeans and cords
- Shorts, skirts and dresses no more than three inches above the knee
- Shoes appropriate for both outdoor and indoor use being worn at all times
- Hair that is neatly trimmed, combed and of a natural hair color

CMH was approved in 2005 to offer this internationally recognized program of study and is one of only two Catholic IB schools in the state of Wisconsin.

Daily Schedules

Listed times are beginning of periods. The day begins with a prayer, the Pledge of Allegiance and birthdays. Announcements are read at the end of 3rd period and at the end of the day. The day ends with a prayer. Daily schedules are run on an A-day/B-day schedule. An A-day runs periods 1-8 and a B-day runs as periods 8-1. The days are simply flip-flopped. All school Masses are usually held once a month. In-Services are usually the second Wednesday of each month.
